'NC 2662 7013: The summit cairn on Cnoc a Ghiubhuais is a dome of laid flags, 4.0.m. in diameter and 1.9.m. high with a 1.0.m. wide pavement around the base. To the NE is a kerbed cairn of flags, 6.0.m. in diametet and 1.0.m. high. One hundred and eighty metres east of the summit cairn are three surviving walls of a dwelling 6.0.m. by 4.0.m with hear h, chimney-butt and entrance to the W. About 30.0.m. east of this is a shelter roofed with large flags, 2.5.m. by 2.0.m. overall and 1.0.m. high internally.' (1)

'The summit cairn on Cnoc a Ghiubhuais, as described by Welsh is modern. The cairn to the NE, which he describes at 6.0m. in diameter is also fairly recent and apparently of similar style though new ruinous; it measures 3.2m. across and incorporates a large number of boulders. The 'Dwelling' and'shelter' to the E of the summit are fairly recent, but their purpose in such a remote and exposed position is uncertain.'
