BADAN MHUGAIDH

Field with clearance heaps, centreing on NG848547; a track from the shore cuts through this field and joins the old township track which now leads to 'the log cabin'. This whole area has become infested with Rhododendron Ponticum. Near the top of the field track and on the downside, are the footings of a building , now very overgrown with rhododendron. At NG849547 is an unroofed drystone 'barn'; although there are gable ends now, it must have been of the 'black house type' as cruck slots are still in situ, showing to advantage this type of feature (see photo)

In the area of the log cabin, the footings of the three buildings noted on the map are still to be seen, but the rhododendron will soon be covering them. Each building has three compartments, and the attached kaleyard is to be seen on the westernmost of the three ruins. It also has an additional feature built on the back.

BALGY,

Remains of a small settlement with walled fields and clearance heaps. The old byre at NG845544 is being converted into a holiday house, with disturbance to the site. Above the main road are the remains of three buildings, that nearest the road having thick, rounded walls and being the smallest of the three. On the down side of the road and close to the byre on it's south side are the footings of a large building. The rest of the settlement consists of 6/7 buildings skirting the walled fields.
