(NH 6778 4220) Supposed site of Castle

This is supposed to be the site of the Castle mentioned

in the Statistical Account as having existed at Castle Leathers. It is there called Castle Bathers, but that is evidently a misprint as no one knows such a name. Traces of a large building have been seen here and there are at present two hollows which appear to be the traces of the ditch.

In referring to Castleleathers and Castle-heather, in 1537 the name "Castletown of La. 'ir" appeared in the list of the Castle lands of Inverness reprinted in the 4th volume of the Spalding Club (3) and in a manuscript of 1737 giving Major James Fraser's evidence as a witness, the name appears as "Castle Ladderis or Ladders".

The name this castle bears, would be more suitable to a convent of Monks. It is called in English, Castle Bathers, a corruption of the Gaelic name "Caistal nen boirach", that is the castle of the "recluse or retired " a monastery in Gaelic is indifferently termed "Manachinn" the "residence of the monks" or "Lecirnamanach" the " retreat or retirement of the Menks"

The estate of Castle Leathers was anciently provided with its own keep or tower.

The site of the Castle is a levelled of area situated on a gentle north facing slope. The cite is a subrectangular platform measuring c.40 Cm. along three sides and c.30 Cm, along the S.E. Side. It is 1-2.0m high Surrounding it on three sides is a broad ditch varying from c.20.0m. wide on the east side to c.80m. on the N.W. The counterscarp of the ditch has been ploughed down at the north angle, and the turn is only just discernible. On the S.W. side is the natural slope to a burn. The site has been used as a dumping ground for field stores and rubbish. No traces of buildings exist on the platform.It is known locally as the site of Castle Heather. Published 25" revised.
