"NH 859 531. A complex group of crop-marks has been recorded in a field 800m E of Kinlhyle. They comprise a double ditched square enclosure with a central pit, a square barrow, at least twelve circular enclosures varying from 12m to 20m in diameter, five ring ditches measuring 5m to 9m in diameter, and a number of indeterminate crop-marks. Features visible within some of the circular enclosures and ring-ditches may represent stone or timber setm settings". (1) (a)

"At least ten circles of post holes or pits may be seen on the air photographs; possibly they may be sites of round timber houses, broadly comparable with the primary phase at West OVER

52. "Plean (NS 88 NW 5), though they could have served a funerary or ritual purpose". (2)
