356. **Former Manse, Kilchoan.** This building (Pl. 84D), which was erected as a manse for the parish of Ardnamurchan about 1790 and considerably enlarged in 1829,⁴ is now occupied as a private residence. The original dwelling comprised a two-storeyed rectangular block measuring 12.3 m from E to W by 6.7 m transversely, which in 1829 was doubled in size by the construction against the S wall of a second gabled block of similar dimensions. The S façade of this addition is of three bays, the outer windows of the ground-floor being distinguished by narrow flanking lights. The principal entrance, in the W gable of the added block, gives access to a longitudinal passage from which a staircase rises in the centre of the original house. The interior was completely reconstructed in 1829, and the dining-room, at the SE angle of the ground-floor, retains a pilastered wooden fireplace-surround and panelled doors and shutters of that period.
